Start to Talk is a new Child Safe Sport awareness campaign from Play by the Rules.

Start to Talk is a national campaign aimed at promoting child safety by encouraging parents and sporting organisations to discuss how to create a child safe environment.

The campaign asks users to **read, download and discuss Child Safe Sport** resources developed by Sport Integrity Australia.



The campaign was developed in response to recommendations from the <u>Royal Commission</u> which identified sport clubs as having an important role to play in the prevention and detection of abuse. It is based on a <u>European child safety campaign</u> lead by the Council of Europe.

The campaign is due to be launched in Australia on 1 June 2023. **Start to Talk** Ambassadors will be speaking to the media about the campaign and TV and Radio CSAs will be released to the media and via the PBTR website.
