Pillar 1 - Governance

Paddler levy 2020-2021

AusDBF confirmed the paddler levy for 2020-2021 financial year would be - \$30.00 per person (adults) and \$15.50 per person (juniors)

Pillar 2 – Development

- AusDBF is investigating software options to develop online e-training for the Coaching and Race Officials Courses which is expected to be launched early next year.
- AusDBF asks all Member States to remind Individual members of the correct process to renew memberships to avoid creating multiple profiles.
- By January AusDBF hopes to have uploaded details of all the Coaching Accreditation to individual member profiles within revSPORT, which will enable automated reminders when accreditation renewals are due.

- Over the last few months AusDBF has been slowly and methodically working through uploading Aurora's representation into revSPORT which includes recording Team Member, Team Managers, Team Captains and Flag Bearers. Asian Championships from 2010 to 2018 has been completed, World Cup Campaigns 2014 to 2018 and IDBF World Championships 2017 and 2019. There is still a lot of data to find and upload. To complement this work AusDBF has updated the 'Honour Roll'.
