#### **Meeting Dates**

With AusChamps cancelled it meant the opportunity to meet with Members face to face wasn't possible. However, AusDBF is looking forward to the next Q2 Members forum on 14 May and the collaborative and sharing of information between Member States and AusDBF on what is being forecasted for 2020-2021 season. AusDBF has fingers crossed everyone will be able to make the journey west for the Annual General Meeting on 22 November. AusDBF has been working with DBWA and has been able to secure a fantastic location for the meetings and accommodation – Point Walter Recreation and Conference Centre, located on the Swan River and close to the city of Perth. AusDBF plans to incorporate plenty of opportunity for networking, team building and collaborating around the AGM and General Meeting.

## **Governance Training**

AusDBF has been working with AICD in Adelaide to provide a weekend training session for all Member States. Originally scheduled for May and postponed to 18-19 July (at this stage). AusDBF will keep everyone abreast as the COVID situation continues and confirmed dates by end of May. All Member States were due to provide nominations by Thursday 09 April. (Thank you to DBQ, DBSA, DBVIC for their nominations).

## **Sub-Committees**

The Historical Committee (Julie Clinch, Barb Clarkson, Janelle Gamble, Steven Davidson, Daryl Manzie, Julie Davison and John Corcoran) have worked extremely hard over the last 4 months on the AusDBF 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Book – thankyou to everyone for your patience and providing information to the never ending requests. The commemorative book is coming together nicely and is due to be completed by 30 June 2020. AusDBF anticipates presenting the Commemorative Book either at the AGM or AusChamps next year.

The Sweeps Committee met on 02<sup>nd</sup> April with fruitful and collaborative discussions held. Deb Whitfield was elected as Chair of the Committee for the next 12 months. A priority for the Sweeps Committee once paddling resumes and the warm weather returns is to update and re-film the capsize drill. While it was always understood that all sweeps must be minimum of level 3 to compete at AusChamps it has now be included and highlighted in the sweeps documents and will also be included in the next version of the Competition Rules and Regulations. There is plenty of opportunity over a season for new sweeps to progress from L2 or L3 prior to AusChamps. AusDBF encourages all Member States to work with their Sweep Coordinators and Clubs to ensure there are plans in place for Clubs to achieve these goals. It is important that all Clubs who are planning to compete at AusChamps have suitably qualified sweeps.

The Competition & Technical Committee (C&TC) met this week. Sylvia Wong was elected as the Chair for the Committee for the next 12 months. A number of races rules were discussed taking into consideration feedback from members and looking forward as to what the dragon boat landscape may look like in the next 12 months. Recommendations will be made for the AusDBF Board to consider.

The Race Officials Mentors Program (ROMP) Committee are due to meet at the end of April. An update from their meeting will be included in the next Bulletin.

AusDBF is pleased to see a number of the sub-committees are active and using this isolation time to catch up and discuss recommendations for AusDBF consideration.

AusDBF recently established an Athletes Commission with nominations to be considered before end of April. Watch this space for further updates.

AusDBF is also adding 2 members to the C&TC as part of succession planning over then next 2 years. Nominations for consideration closed Thursday 16 April. The new members will be announced in late April

DBWA has already started communicating with AusDBF in relation to AusChamps 2021.

AusDBF has been in communication with IDBF with regards to 2021 and what the plans may be. IDBF has advised while no events will take place in 2020, 2021 is still yet to be determined with ongoing discussions with the various organisers (Dragon Boat Attitude – France), Hong Kong Dragon Boat Association, USDBF (Sarasota),

Spanish Dragon Boat Federation and European Dragon Boat Federation. There are still many pieces of the puzzle which need to be sorted out before further announcements can be made.

For all the 24 clubs who were heading to France and have now had to cancel plans, AusDBF has been in regular contact with V-insurance and communicating with those clubs concerned to keep them updated.

#### Pillar 4 – High Performance

AusDBF wished to thank all the Member States for coordinating the selection trials for Asian Campaign. The Board and Head Coach Dave Abel are communicating regularly as plans are continuously revised to keep pace with the daily information for COVID-19.

Whilst the Asian Dragon Boat Association are still hoping to run the Asian Championships in November and the 4<sup>th</sup> World Cup in October, AusDBF will be guided by the Australian Health and Travel Guidelines before decisions can be made for Australian participation.
