- Show that you care. Listen and be empathetic. Your learning will develop quickly if you do this.

- Do you have a welcoming environment for a PwD to be at your club or organisation?
 - Try the Sport4All Club Inclusion Scorecard
- Meaningful engagement > number of engagements.
 - It's not about the numbers!
- Person-centred approach
 - How to become an inclusive coach UK
- Who are you partnering with outside of sport?
 - o e.g. allied health, disability services
- Could people with disabilities be involved in other roles?
 - All Things Equal Café Disability Social Enterprise Café and local football canteen

• Are PwD involved in the recruitment process for your inclusive programs?

Online Accessibility

- Do you have a welcoming flyer? If so, is it accessible?
- Do your social media posts have Image or Video IDs?
- Avoid all caps and italics
- Use plain, simple English
- Have you downloaded a contrast checker e.g. <u>Google Chrome Contrast Checker</u>
- Does your website have an accessibility widget?
 E.g. <u>Userway</u>
