Thank you to the 46 clubs who participated in the **National Rainbow Come and Try weekend** on the **17/18 September**. Due to a few regattas' clashes, VIC held their come & try the weekend before. AusDBF appreciated the commitment shown by the participating clubs to attend the Pride in Sport online training and all club coaches and committee completed the Play by the Rules – LGBTQ Inclusive Club training as part of the requirements for being involved in the day. AusDBF worked with Gambit Collective to provide the social media advertising. It is estimated approx 250 people registered their interest to participate in the national come & try.

AusDBF is currently working with Pride in Sport to finalise several resources and polices as part of the grant due for completion by the end of the year.

Ian Gearey has been asked by Pride in Sport to present at their Pride in Practice conference in Melbourne on 30 November on AusDBF's national come & try campaign.

AusDBF will be partnering with DBNSW to help promote the World Pride Regatta 'Drag on Darling' to be held at Darling Harbour on 04 March 2023.

The D&I Committee is trialing an online program 'Club Kick Starter program' design by Inclusion Sport Design.







In 2023 AusDBF is researching the opportunity to work with Disability Sports Australia (Sports Incubation program) which will provide pathways into this sector.

DRACADEMY

Thank you to Zijing Chu who has been working hard on the development of the DRACADEMY program which will be included in Sporting Schools – term 4 sporting options, for the first time. This is an exciting step forward in dragon boat to be able to have national reach into schools, initially focusing on years 7 and 8.

AusDBF has issued the Safe365 APP to all the Coaches involved in DRACADEMY as part of the safety requirements for Sporting Schools.

AusDBF has appointed Cherry Harvey who is based in Queensland for the Schools Coordinator role and will be working closely with Zijing to help with the workload for the Sporting Schools program.

Coaching Course Presenters

Held their second face to face meeting in Sydney on 03/04 September facilitated by Rex Tindal, which was attended by Maggie Boyce (DBQ), Mary Davis, Wendy Orman, Sylvia Wong (NSW), Jennifer Brown (VIC), Alison Mourant (DBTAS), John Holland (DBSA) and Laura Hughes (DBWA). Carlos Diz also attended the weekend as part of the succession handover from Rex Tindal. The weekend included a special presentations. from Ian Gearey on Diversity & Inclusion and Sylvia Wong (Para-Dragons). The group spent their time productively reviewing all the resources for Level 1 and Level 2 courses as well as the launch of the Level 3 course.

To make the reaccreditation processes more efficient, AusDBF has created an option in the AusDBF shop where coaches can go online and pay for their reaccreditation. Once paid they will receive a receipt directly from revSPORT which they can include in the documents required by the Coach Presenters.

Sweeps Committee

Held a face-to-face meeting in Sydney on 24/25 September which was attended by Norm Hunt, Blair Gamble (DBQ), Rob Turnbull, Rodney Moore (DBNSW), Kevin Shipp (DBACT), Jennifer Reilly (DBV), Sue Sanderson (DBTAS) Pat Doogue (DBSA) and Laura Hughes (DBWA) and chaired by John Holland. Carlos Diz also attended the weekend as part of the succession handover from Rex Tindal with the Development portfolio. Robust discussions were held over the 2 days resulting in all Member States agreeing to move forward and adopt a consistent national approach to Sweep Classification levels, training, and processes. The Sweep Classification document is currently with the AusDBF Board for sign-off and will be launched to the Member States in November.

The new capsize drill video was reviewed with final editing taking placing and due to be released to the Member States in November.

Kevin Shipp from DBACT was elected as the new Chair of the Sweep Committee.

Rule Change

At the 2022 AusChamps trialed a rule change allowing BCS teams to combine. However, if clubs wanted to qualify for CCWC then they were required to compete as their own team to comply with IDBF Rules. Following feedback after AusChamps, AusDBF has agreed to include the rule change in Edition 10 of the AusDBF Competition Regulation and Rules of Racing which is due for release at end of November 2022.
