Pillar 1 - Governance

National Anti-Doping Policy

Please be advised that AusDBF's Anti-Doping Policy changed on **January 2021**. AusDBF has adopted the Australian National Anti-Doping Policy which was developed by Sport Integrity Australia to reflect the changes to the World Anti-Doping Code and Australian legislation.

All members of AusDBF are bound by the Australian National Anti-Doping Policy. This includes athletes, support personnel and employees whose employment contracts enables this. The policy can be found on the Sport Integrity Australia website here <u>https://www.sportintegrity.gov.au/what-we-do/anti-doping</u>

It is important that all members including athletes and support personnel, have a strong understanding of their obligations under the new policy. Changes include a new anti-doping rule violation of retaliation, a category of athletes that is lower-level, and flexibility related to sanctioning for certain levels of athletes/participants.

During January there will be weekly Facebook posts with regards to the changes occurring with the World Anti-Doping Code. AusDBF encourages all clubs to share the posts with their members.

National Sports Tribunal

At the December 2020 AusDBF Board meeting, AusDBF resolved to refer Member Protection mediations to the **National Sports Tribunal (NST)** and to appoint the **National Sports Tribunal (NST)** as the Tribunal to hear any disciplinary cases. - <u>https://www.nationalsportstribunal.gov.au/</u>

The National Sports Tribunal provides an independent, cost-effective dispute resolution services to sporting bodies, athletes and support personnel. The Tribunal Members act as independent third parties to help resolve first-instance disputes or appeals. They offer a range of binding and non-binding dispute resolution services.

Sport Integrity Australia is developing a new National Integrity Framework which will provide a cohesive approach to integrity matters in sport. This will include policies dealing with Complaints Handling, Disciplinary Breaches and Member Protection. The new Framework is due to be available in the first quarter of 2021 and will replace the current Member Protection Policy. Until the new Framework is in place the current Member Protection Policy is still valid and should be followed if circumstances arise.

Pillar 2 – Development

AusDBF Buy-Sell-Swap-Donate Facebook Group (BSSD)

AusDBF has developed a **Buy, Sell, Swap Donate (BSSD) Facebook Group** to support the dragon boat community Australia-wide to buy, sell, swap, look for and even donate dragon boat equipment and resources with each other.

To join the group, you just need to be an individual dragon boat club member from an AusDBF-affiliated Club anywhere in Australia, or even a Club itself. (Your State/Member organisation is already on board!) As this group provides services for these participants, businesses, including retailers or wholesalers, are not eligible to join.

To join, from your News Feed, click 'Groups' in the left-hand menu. Start typing '**AusDBF Buy Sell Swap and Donate'** (<u>https://www.facebook.com/groups/381645373055821</u>) in the search bar. Select the group and click 'Join Group'. Your eligibility will be verified (through revSPORT) and you'll be advised once you're in. Coach Presenters

AusDBF eLearning platform is up and running with the first students from the recently held courses in Queensland and New South Wales trialing the online modules. Initial reports from the presenters have been positive as the online modules freed up time during the face-to-face learning to allow for more on water time with the participants.

Rex has been beavering away over the break updating the documents for the Level 1 course as well as working on the Level 2 course content. The intention is the current Coaching presenters in each State will have the ability to present the Level 1 and Level 2 Coaching Courses. The Level 3 and Level 4 Coaching Course content is still a work in progress. The Level 2 Coaching Course should be ready to be rolled out in the first half of 2021. AusDBF will issue an EDM to all Members and Coach Presenters when its ready to be launched.

Sweep Accreditation

The Sweep Coordinators are due to meet again on the 15 January, whn they will review the recommendation for compulsory wearing of PFDs for sweeps and drummers. In addition, the Sweep Coordinators are undertaking the review of the AusDBF Safety Handbook where it is anticipated any amendments for change will be submitted to the AusDBF Board for consideration at their February Board meeting. There has been an agreed shift in the administration process for accrediting sweeps. The training, running courses, assessments accreditations and reaccreditations will still be run at the State Level, however, the updates and recording of data will now be entered at the National level by AusDBF via the revSPORT accreditation module.

ROMP (Race Officials Mentor Program) AusDBF appreciates it has been a slow and bumpy start to the season for States and the way in which they are able to hold regattas. However there is still a large percentage of race officials across Australia who have yet to re-accredit or contact AusDBF/ local ROMP rep and asked to be removed from the distribution list. This has been disappointing to date. AusDBF encourages all States to work with your ROMP reps to encourage the previously accredited race officials in your State to re-accredit. It is important race officials retain current knowledge of rule changes and the intent of implementation.

The Auroras Head Coach David Abel and AusDBF High Performance Director Sylvia Wong are seeking elite paddling athletes from all age divisions and categories to represent Australia (the Auroras) at the 15th IDBF World Nations Championships (WNC).

WNC will be held in Hong Kong in 2021 from 1st to 7th November. The race venue is located at Kwun Tong Promenade, Kowloon. Athletes are expected to arrive from 31st October 2021.

AusDBF is aware that there is a current ban on overseas travel from Australia. It is closely monitoring the situation including travel updates on Hong Kong and following government recommendations. We recommend all potential Auroras regularly check the Smart Traveller website
