NAP (National Athletes Pathways) – have met and reviewed and made recommendations to update the National Athletes Pathway document.

AusChamps Review Working Group – have been meeting regularly and reviewing different forms of data collected over the last 5-7 years of AusChamps before making their final recommendations to the Board for consideration to the structure of AusChamps moving forward.

Athletes Commission – have met and submitted recommendations to both the AusChamps Review Working Group and the C&TC for discussion and consideration.

Historical Committee – Have been working hard on the AusDBF 25th Anniversary Book – Fast n Furious, which is nearing completion. AusDBF hopes everyone will enjoy the trip down memory lane from past to present. The book includes dozens of photos, facts, and history about dragon boating in Australia over the last 25 years.

revSPORT Users Group – has been meeting regularly to share knowledge and experiences and find ways in which AusDBF Members can work together on national approaches with revSPORT.

In the process of completing the Australian Representation piece of work, it was discovered there were well over 1450 individuals in revSPORT sharing the same National ID. This meant the bulk uploads previously completed for Coaching and Australian Representation were allocated to the wrong individual. New national ID numbers have had to be allocated to individuals sharing the same national ID. Once this process was completed, the next step was to transfer accreditations to the correct person. Unfortunately, revSPORT believe this may have happened when the AusDBF Members originally transferred to revSPORT and bulk uploads of data were completed. Fingers crossed the situation has now been cleaned up and rectified going forward. Accreditations updated by name were fine, it was the accreditation entered by national ID which had been affected. Most should have been rectified,

but there may be still be a handful which escaped. If any incorrect accreditations show up, please let Melanie know.

Australian Representation data which has been a 6-month piece of work has now been completed. Both individuals and AusDBF Members can view the data via the accreditation module. The data will be able to provide insights into Australian Team Representation which previously has not been possible and will assist with planning and decision making for future campaigns. Detailed information will be included in the Annual report however, below is a snapshot.

Pillar 2 – Development

AusDBF eLearning platform is on track to be launched at the end of October. Online learning modules will be available as part of Level 1, Level 2 and Level 3 Coaching Courses.

Pillar 3 – Events

AusDBF will be reviewing the status of 2021 AusChamps at the end of November when further information is known on what is happening with the State borders re-opening.

Entry fees for 2021 AusChamps will be accepted both via eft (invoiced via revSPORT) and PIN payment (via revSPORT).

AusDBF appreciates everyone is anxious to know what is happening and nobody wants to see a repeat of 2020 cancellation. AusDBF is keeping abreast of what is happening and can only make educated decisions on known information.

AusDBF also appreciates each State and Territory is in a different phase and this may impact 2021 AusChamps as well.

Pillar 4 - High Performance

AusDBF has been receiving several enquiries from paddlers wanting to know what is happening for 2021 IDBF Nations, what the trial criteria is and when the camps are going to be held. Until the States and Territories open their borders, trials and selection camps are all on hold. AusDBF is hoping by early next year, Australia will have better insights into what is happening around the world.
