'ANROAS' – AusDBF National Race Officials Accreditation Program Updated – January 2024

LEVEL 1

- Complete the below online courses prior to participating in the course:
 - a. Play by the Rules Walking the Talk module
 - b. Play by the Rules Introduction to Integrity in Sport module
 - c. Sport Integrity Australia National Integrity Framework module
 - d. Sport Integrity Australia Child Safeguarding in Sport Introduction module
 - e. Sport Integrity Australia Competition Manipulation & Sports Betting module
- Recommend volunteering at a regatta prior to attending course
- Participate actively in one (1) day course (theory) with AusDBF Presenter and Assessor
- Complete the written exam
- Officiate at one (1) regatta and be assessed within three (3) months of attending course.

If successful will be awarded level 1 race official accreditation.

Note: Failure to officiate at a regatta within three (3) months, will require applicant to start again and attend next available course (unless extenuating circumstances are approved by ROMP representative).

• Will receive AusDBF Officials Logbook to record all race officiating experience.

Re-accredit as Level 1 - Race Official must have:

- officiated at one (1) regatta annually
- completed online training annually with 80% pass mark. Upon completion of renewal an electronic certificate will be issued, and notification sent to the State ROMP representative.
- It is the responsibility of the race official to re-accredit annually to ensure they remain valid.
- It is recommended for race officials to try different roles to gain further experience
- Will be eligible to receive complimentary grey race official polo shirt and cap to wear

LEVEL 2

Must have:

- Completed below online course prior to participating in the course
 - a. Play by the Rules Ethics and Ethical Decision Making in Sport module
- attended Grade (2) two (1) one day training workshop
- demonstrated level (1) one competency
- completed written and oral exam with 80% pass mark
- To be considered for Level 2, race officials must be able to demonstrate competency and confidence in minimum of 3 roles identified below (refer to Roles and Responsibilities document) frontline race officials
 - o Marshalls
 - Marshall Secretary

- Marshall Announcer
- o Race Admin
- Time Keepers
- Boat Loaders/Handers
- Water umpires
- Start aligners

Re-accredit as Level 2 – Race Official must have:

- officiated at (2) two regattas including festival events such as Coast-to-Coast, Cross Border Cup, Pan Pacs, Australian Masters Games or State Championships
- completed online training annually with 80% pass mark. Upon completion of renewal an electronic certificate will be issued and notification sent to the State ROMP representative.
- It is the responsibility of the race official to re-accredit annually to ensure they remain current.

LEVEL 3

Must have:

- Completed below online course prior to participating in the course
 - a. Play by the Rules Harassment and Discrimination module
 - b. Play by the Rules Complaint Handling module
- attended Grade (3) three (1) one day training workshop
- demonstrated level (2) two competency
- completed written and oral exam with 80% pass mark
- To be considered for Level 3, race officials must be able to demonstrate competency and confidence in minimum of 3 roles plus Assistant Chief Official identified below (refer to Roles and Responsibilities document)
 - Leadership Team race officials
 - Chief Marshall
 - Chief Boat Loader/handler
 - Chief Water Umpire (States L2)
 - Chief Judge
 - Race Secretary (States L2)
 - o Protocol
- demonstrated competency and understanding of AusDBF Competition Rules and Regulations, position descriptions and, particularly, understanding of 2km racing.

Re-accredit as Level 3 - Race Official must have:

- officiated at two (2) regattas including minimum 2 days at AusChamps every 2 years
- completed online training annually with 80% pass mark. Upon completion of renewal an electronic certificate will be issued and notification sent to the State ROMP representative.
- It is the responsibility of the race official to re-accredit annually to ensure they remain current.
